MedStar Franklin Square Medical Center is a proud partner of the Healthy Babies Collaborative, a team of local organizations with a common interest in promoting positive birth outcomes for mothers and their families in southeast Baltimore County. Our shared vision

is babies born healthy and raised in safe and stable families and communities. With funding from such organizations as the Baltimore County Department of Planning, the Collaborative offers education, resources, and support to families at risk.

Initiatives include home visits with new moms, breastfeeding and behavioral health training for service providers, and a list of local lactation resources. At our weekly Essex Breastfeeding Moms Luncheon, a certified lactation consultant provides information and support, community professionals provide education on group-generated topics like vaccinations, and the library offers a private monthly program to encourage literacy and family interaction. The program has assisted 23 mothers this year to initiate or continue nursing their babies.
